Read for the Win



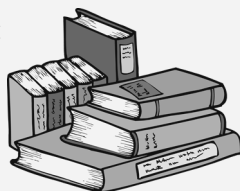
"Read for the Win!" this summer at the Rochester Public Library District. **Sign-up begins on Tuesday, May 16th for the summer reading program**, with children able to participate all

Teens (Ages 12-18) are also welcome to sign-up! You will receive a bag with a bookmark and a list of our teen events this summer. We ask that you complete a Summer Reading BINGO card. Each completed BINGO card gives you a ticket for prize drawings at the end of the summer!

Book Donation Policy

The Library is grateful for donations throughout the year. Your donations help us acquire materials that we might otherwise have been unable to purchase, and also supply us with materials for our annual Book Sale. However, due to the high volume of donations, we are only currently able to receive donations on Tuesdays and Thursdays; donations should be brought in a disposable container that we can keep. We also ask that donations are not put in the book drop. We cannot accept *Magazines, Textbooks, Encyclopedias, Reader's Digest Condensed Books, VHS and cassette tapes, and materials with mold, insect, or other natural damage.*

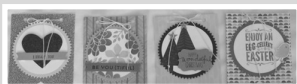

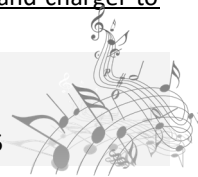

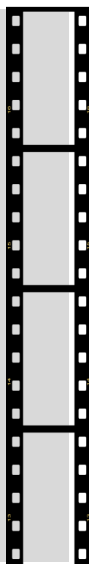

4th Annual School Supply Drive throughout July

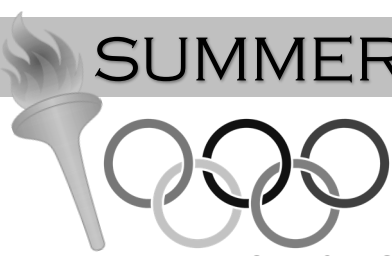

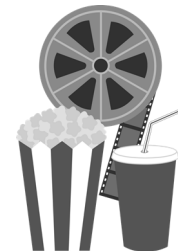

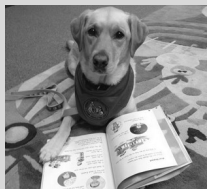
