Your child will be able to use these fun colorful shakers to explore probability or for generating random numbers for board games. After completing the shakers we will play a fun probability game!



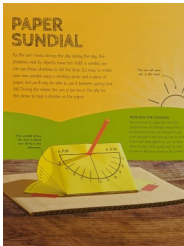
Science | Technology | Engineering | Arts | Mathematics

Paper Sundial

This experiment will show kids how to make their own sundial and how to read it. You will only be able to use it between the spring and fall. During the winter, the sun is too low in the sky for the straw to cast a shadow on the paper.

Latitude Locator

Cool Compass

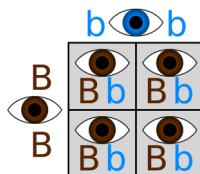
