POETRY OUT LOUD

The library is Hosting Poetry Out Loud this year. We will meet weekly via Zoom to practice for no longer than an hour. We will discuss how to memorize the poems and discuss the elements of a successful recitation. *Homeschool Students Only*

Student Eliqibility

- **Grade Level:** Only currently enrolled students in grades 9-12 are eligible, with an exception made for 8th -grade students participating in a 9th- through 12th-grade class.
- State Finals: A student may not advance to the state finals without competing in a lower-level competition.
- **Legal Participation Requirements:** No student may be excluded from participating in Poetry Out Loud on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, disability, or national origin.

Poetry Out Loud begins at a classroom level. Winners advance to a schoolwide competition, then to a regional and/or state competition, and ultimately to the National Finals.

State Awards:

Each winner at the state level will receive \$200 and an all-expenses-paid trip (with an adult chaperone) to Washington, DC, to compete at the National Finals(this year the Washington DC Finals will be virtual so there will not be a trip). The state winner's school/host will receive \$500 for poetry materials. One runner-up in each state will receive \$100; their school/host will receive \$200 for the purchase of poetry materials.

National Awards:

A total of \$50,000 in awards and school stipends will be given at the Poetry Out Loud National Finals, including a \$20,000 award for the National Champion.
