LICENSE PLATE RENEWAL

FREE COVID-19 SELF-SWAB TESTING NOW AVAILABLE

We are excited to partner with ARSL, Color Health, and the CDC to offer free, easy to access COVID-19 testing for our community. Rochester Public Library will provide self-swab PCR test kits onsite beginning August 1, Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Patients can sign up, get a free test kit, swab themselves, and drop off their kit at our site collection bin all in the same visit – and receive their results via text in less than 48 hours. It was a unanimous decision that the money earned would go directly to fulfilling the wish list of the youth department. The girls participated in the season's first Local Farmers Market on June 12th. With the community's support, they earned \$281.00, allowing the purchase of thirty-four new titles.
